# **Board Highlights for October 17, 2023**

**THUNDER BAY, ON (October 17, 2023)** — The Thunder Bay Police Services Board (TBPSB) convened this morning. Following are notable items from today's meeting:

# **Deputation**

Jason Veltri, President of the Rainbow Collective of Thunder Bay, and Scotia Kauppi, Chair of the Thunder Pride Association, provided an update to the Thunder Bay Police Services Board on the safety and security concerns facing the Queer, Trans and Non-Binary communities in Thunder Bay, and shared the security concerns and threats faced by those communities during the 2023 Pride month.

# **Reports of Committees**

a) Thunder Bay Police Service – Joint Health & Safety Committee

Inspector Derek West, Co-Chair of the TBPS Joint Health & Safety Committee, provided an overview of the activities of the TBPS Joint Health & Safety Committee for the period of January 1, 2023 to September 30, 2023.

a) <u>Inquest – Seven First Nations Youth – Annual Report</u>

Chief D. Fleury provided an overview relative to the Implementation Status Report of the Thunder Bay Police Service, relative to the Inquest into the Deaths of Seven First Nations Youths, for the Board's information. The Report outlined significant work both completed and ongoing. (Page 20-27).

## d) BriefCam

The Board received a memo from Detective Inspector J. Pearson relative to a request to use BriefCam video analytics software, for the Board's information. (Page 33)

Detective Inspector J. Pearson provided an overview relative to the above noted, highlighting both the support of ongoing investigations and savings in staffing resources that this represents.

The Board authorized the use of the software, by trained members of the Service only, and will look to reports on the use of the software in support of developing a broader policy on the use of artificial intelligence software by the Service.

#### **General Matters**

## a) 2023 Board Budget Status Report

The Board received a memo from Mr. J. Hannam, Secretary to the Thunder Bay Police Services Board, relative to the status of the 2023 Board Budget, re-presented for the Board's information. (Pages 34-25)

At the September 19, 2023 Regular Session of the Board, the above noted memorandum was presented. Newly-appointed Board Members Bahlieda and Councillor Etreni requested more background information on how Board expenses are communicated to Board members.

Mr. J. Hannam, Secretary to the Thunder Bay Police Services Board provided an overview relative to the above noted.

The following resolution was re-presented for the Board's consideration and approved:

With respect to the reporting of invoices paid and charged against the annual operating budget, we recommend that the Thunder Bay Police Services Board direct Administration to cease the practice, replacing it with a monthly budget summary.

#### b) Thunder Bay Police Services Board – Third Quarter Variance Report

The Board received a memo from Mr. J. Hannam, Secretary to the Thunder Bay Police Services Board, relative to an update on the status of the Operational Budget of the Thunder Bay Police Services Board as of September 30, 2023, for the Board's information. (Page 36).

## c) Special Account Policy

The following motion was presented for the Board's consideration and the motion was deferred to the next Governance Committee meeting in November for further review.

With respect to the Memorandum to the Board's Governance Committee from Malcolm Mercer, Administrator, dated August 25, 2023, relative to a proposed policy for the Board's Special Account, as presented at the October 17, 2023 Regular Session of the Board;

THAT the Thunder Bay Police Services Board approves the Special Account Policy.

## d) OIPRD Report Recommendations

Chief D. Fleury provided an overview relative to the summary of status/progress of the OIPRD Recommendations since last presented May 23, 2023, for the Board's information and the productive meeting that was held with the OIPRD, the Service and the Board on September 22nd. The meeting highlighted both the considerable progress that has been made, and placed an emphasis on key areas that require focussed effort by both the Service and the Board moving forward.

#### e) First Nations Grand Chief's Forum

The Board received a memo from Chief D. Fleury relative to the First Nations Grand Chief's Forum, for the Board's information. (Page 39-40).

Chief D. Fleury provided an overview of the above noted.

The following motion was presented for the Board's consideration and approved:

With respect to the First Nations Grand Chief's Forum being hosted by the Thunder Bay Police Service and the Anishinabek Nation, the Thunder Bay Police Services Board approves to support and assist the Thunder Bay Police Service with the costs of this forum from the Board's Special Account, excluding travel and accommodation for guests.

## f) Remembrance Day 2023

Mr. J. Hannam, Secretary to the Board, provided an overview relative to the local ceremonies scheduled for Saturday, November 11, 2023. Board representation at local ceremonies was confirmed for the Waverly Park Cenotaph, Fort William Gardens, Fort William First Nation and the Slovak Legion.

At the May 23, 2023 Regular Session of the Board, Mr. J. Hannam, Secretary, provided an overview of proposed changes and updates to the Board's website. The Board approved the expenditure required to update the website, and it was noted that, once completed, a presentation would be made to the Board on the new features and design changes.

Mr. J. Hannam provided an overview of the new features on the Board's website. Board members expressed their support for the new site that presents a fresh new look and identity for the Board, backed with content to help inform the public on the work of the Board.
