Annual Report

Quarterly reports will be used to create the Annual Report, now a Board responsibility under the new *Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA)*, 2019. Annual reports must now be filed on or before June 30, 2025. Quarterly reports will 3/4 pages with sections covering what is legislatively required in the annual report:

- Police service updates;
- Labour Relations and Governance Committee updates;
- Recommendation progress tracker; and
- Other news.

Quarterly reports will be proactively sent to media a posted on TBPSB website.
